

TE WHARE ANGITU 2024 ACADEMIC COURSES

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR TUMUAKI

BEFORE ENROLMENT

Kura **must attend** a pre-enrolment ZOOM hui to learn more about our:

1. Expectations
2. Commitment
3. Learning Approach

Kura are **expected** to agree and sign the **Kawa Angitu**, which outlines the expectations between Te Whare Angitu, kura, kaiako, uri and their whānau during the course.

Courses are designed for uri who attend kura that are currently unable to provide NCEA level teaching within these curriculum areas.

Te Whare Angitu cannot accept enrolments from uri who already have a similar course being offered by their kura.

There is a **maximum of 5 uri** per kura into each course (per level).

AFTER ENROLMENT

Kura are expected to **allocate** a 'kaitakawaenga' (*one of their kaiako*) to support their uri during the course and be a key contact for Te Whare Angitu.

For wānanga ā kanohi, kura are **expected** to:

- Cover the cost of transporting their uri to the wānanga
- Send the kaitakawaenga to accompany uri at the wānanga

Te Whare Angitu will enter into a subcontracting agreement with kura to assess the NCEA standards on your behalf. This agreement will allow Te Whare Angitu to assess under your consent to assess. These agreements last for three years.

COURSE FEES

The cost per course - per uri is estimated at **\$600.00**

Kura will be invoiced the fees for each uri being enrolled.

Course fees cover the cost of:

- Accommodation and kai at wānanga
- Course resources (e.g. water testing kits, postage, field trip costs for Rakahinonga, resources for product development etc.)
- Contributes to kaimahi resource costs for courses.

ENROLMENT PROCESS

1. Uri completes the online enrolment application form with support from a kaiako.
2. The application includes uri providing us with a 1-minute video telling us about themselves and why they want to do the course.
3. Kaiako will be contacted to provide information about the uri, including academic achievement information.
4. Tumuaki will be contacted and asked to endorse the application.
5. If required for the course, uri will be contacted and asked to complete an entrance task to determine their readiness for the programme.
6. Te Whare Angitu will assess the application and inform the uri and kura of the outcome.
7. If successful, uri will be invited to the course and must complete Te Hōtaka Whakariterite (3 week online course) during term 4, 2023.
